

LINCOLNSHIRE EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE SCHEME: GRANT FOR FOOD AND ESSENTIAL SERVICES

MONITORING REQUIREMENTS (Subject to revisions)

Data on the following, arising specifically from the grant, at two data collection points: at 6 weeks after the issue of the grant and at three months after the issue of the grant, which should coincide with the ending of the grant expenditure.

We appreciate that some organisations may not be as well placed to respond to the full data request and that their first priority is serving those in food need. In these circumstances, we will accept data which relates directly to the project. Some of the additional data requested will help us collate a more developed view of the wider food support network across the county, helping us to support the development of this infrastructure in the longer term. We do not want the data collection process to become too onerous - if you have any concerns regarding the data requirements, please don't hesitate to contact us as we wish to support as many eligible organisations as we can with this funding.

Numbers and demographic characteristics

- Total number of people supported (total, under 18, 18 – 65, 66 and over)
- Total number of people who would consider themselves to be disabled
- Total number of people supported by referral type/reason (for example, sickness, wage issue, benefits issue, domestic violence, homelessness, debt, Covid 19 related – self isolation, Covid 19 related – other) and without a formal referral
- Total number of people who collected food parcels
- Total number of people to whom food parcels were delivered
- Provision by postcode (where available)

Distribution processes

- Principal means of referral - monitor top three
- Main methods of making your service known (% estimate) telephone, email, on-line, virtual, face to face, group newsletter, through other services?
- What are the main methods that you have used for sourcing food?
- Do you work in collaboration with other food banks in sourcing food?
- What are your main constraints to effective operation? How have these changed since the onset of Covid?
